Funded by Arts Council England and delivered by Newark and Sherwood District Council, you'll find our team running activities in museums, libraries, schools, theatres, and other venues across the district.

Our programme includes:

- Pop-up activities
- Theatre, music, and creative arts workshops in our sites across Newark and Sherwood
- Artists in schools and communities
- Professional development for creatives and teachers
- Workshops in schools, tailored to a range of ages and abilities
- Opportunities for young people, including the Arts Award qualifications Discover and Explore.

Outreach Sessions

Book a full-day, half-day, or single-lesson session with one of our creative arts team.

We can bring exciting performance experiences to your classroom, from storytelling to puppet play, musical activities, and curriculum-linked drama sessions.

Theatre Tours

Bring your class to the Palace Theatre Newark, where they'll have a chance to peek behind the curtain and see what goes on backstage!

Loan Boxes

Borrow one of our story bags filled with props, costumes, British Sign Language signs, and music. The children were hooked immediately!

Continuing Professional Development for Teachers

If you need help embedding music into your school's curriculum, we can provide planning advice, resources, and deliver staff meetings.



We offer sessions for all ages and abilities that can be tailored to your pupils' needs.

Each session meets points of the national curriculum and aims to develop of a love of music, drama, storytelling, writing, and performance.

Every outreach sessions includes:

- A full or half-day's activity for up to thirty children
- An experienced creative arts officer to faciliate
- Props, costumes, signs, and music
- Tips for developing the work after the session has ended.

Preschool - Palace Players

Enjoy an hour of music and movement in these sessions, suitable for toddlers to children aged four.

- Discover the musical instruments in our big blue bag of jingles
- Listen and play along to music around the world
- Enjoy parachute games, dancing, and storytime
- Meet our cuddly friends Octavius the Spider, Peekaboo the Bunny, Mother Duck and her naughty ducklings, and our five bouncing monkeys, who will help teach pulse, beat, and rhythm.

These sessions support children to develop fine and gross co-ordination skills, active listening, social skills, understanding of pulse and rhythm, and confidence.

Key Stage One



Playbox

Full-day session

Learn about the people who create theatre in this one-day interactive introduction.

Your class will discover what it takes to be a director, actor, or stage crew member, along with the ingredients for bringing an exciting story to life. They'll have the chance to delve into our box of costumes and props, and perform their own production of Julia Donaldson's beloved children's story, Room on the Broom.

Puppet Play

Expect a full day of fun, creativity, and performance in this introduction to scriptwriting.

Our creative arts officer will visit your school and introduce your class to different types of plays. Your class will learn about the three-act structure and have a go at writing their own play, as well as create wooden-spoon puppet actors to perform in our pop-up theatre with their friends.

Key Stage Two



You Can Judge a Book by it's Cover!

Half-day

These sessions are dedicated to creative writing, design, and art skills.

Your class will study different genres of fiction writing and cover art techniques, and learn what tempts readers to pick up a book and buy it. Using their new-found knowledge, pupils will plot out their own works of fiction, compose a blurb, and design a front cover of their own.

Chorus Kids

Chorus Kids is a full day of singing, music, and performance.

After physical, facial, and vocal warm-ups, your pupils will learn two songs to perform later in the day.

If you have a school, concert, or assembly you're preparing for, we can tailor Chorus Kids to the songs your pupils need to learn and perform.

Anglo Saxon Theatre

Discover the Anglo-Saxon tale of *Beowulf* in two days of games, drama workshops, interactive storytelling, and theatre learning.

With costumes, script readings, and music, your pupils will dive into a world of legends and create their own performance of this epic tale.

Much Ado About Shakespeare

Burst into the magical world of William Shakespeare!

Choose from The Tempest, MacBeth, or A Midsummer Night's Dream and watch your pupils bring the play to life.

Using drama studio techniques, they will discover beloved characters and recreate scenes from the play, immersing themselves in the story.

Outreach session / Digital resource Loans Box

Ancient Egyptian Theatre

Join us for two days of theatre learning, drama workshops, and history.

Your pupils will have the opportunity to learn, rehearse, and perform a short play based on the Egyptian myth of Rhodophis, the girl with the rose red slippers. Led by a skilled facilitator, your class will learn about scripts, theatre jobs and roles, costuming, and puppet interpretation.

Two days of theatre learning

This session will require the school hall.

Heka, Hathor, and Ihy

Honour the Ancient Egyptian tale of creation with dance, drumming, and storytelling.

Divided into three workshops, this session works brilliantly for large groups of year threes and year fours. Rotating around three creative activities in one day, your pupils will be fully immersed in the sounds, movements, and tales of Ancient Egypt.

Led by one of our experienced facilitators, your teachers and teaching assistants will help deliver an amazing day of creativity filled with music, history, puppetry, and choreography.
